






Manitoba Youth Bowlers Perform Well at YBC Nationals

This year Kyle has been forced to bowl the two-handed delivery rather than the single arm swing due to an injury. He finished with a 172 average after 87 games in the league. Kyle has one 800 series (807) which he posted on January 4, 2015.

The LCTA "Young Kids"



Fred Cole is 88 years young and bowls in the Thursday Night Men's League at Marcin Bowl. He has been knocking down the pins for 58 years and has never missed a season. Fred worked at Dow Chemical for 33 years and next year he will be retired longer than he worked. He has been married to his beautiful wife "Bea" for 64 years. They had two children (Bill and Karen) and have 5 grandkids. Fred has two 300's to his credit, the first one bowled on his 71st birthday. In 2013, at age 83, he rolled 299 in the August Tournament of Roses at Rose Bowl in Windsor. He also has a 11 in a row 290 game under his belt. His highest league average was 204 in 2001, the same season he bowled his first perfect game. His career highest triple is 786.



Rigby Callander was born in Sarnia in 1932 which makes him 87 years young and he has been bowling in the Thursday Night Mixed League at Marcin Bowl for 61 years (previously a Dow Chemical League). He married a beautiful Kitchener girl in 1960 named "Marie" and they had identical twin girls and two sons one of which passed away at an early age of 30. All of his children bowled in the Marcin SMAA Youth Bowling Program at some time where he volunteered as a score marker (for you younger people that is a pencil keeping score on paper). He has 5 adult grandchildren.

Rigby's highest sanctioned scores are 663, 277 single game and a 176 average that he finished with in the 2001-2002 bowling season. He said his average is going down these days but he is still having fun on the lanes

with his fellow bowlers. He has been elected to all of the league's executive positions at one time or another over the years.

He was introduced to 5 pin bowling as a teen where he earned spending money as a pin setter. He said "you had to be fast and agile in the lane pits as those pins flew at you fast and furious. Many times I went home with bruised shins and knuckles".

Rigby reminisced about the year (around 1958) when a team consisting of **Bob Angove**, **Ron Kloske**, **Bob Reeves**, **Fred King** and himself entered the annual Detroit Free Press tournament. They bowled early in the tournament and on the Monday sport page, they received headlines as being the first Canadian team to lead the tournament. On the final weekend he said "all the big guns from Detroit, Windsor and Ohio knocked us down in the standings but we made enough money to get our entry fee back". Rigby's closing info for this report was "I love to bowl and GOD willing, with good health, I will continue to bowl until they carry me off the lanes.

Jay Belliveau tossed 745 (290 – 96 pins over average - 11 strikes in a row – 241 – 157 pins over average for three games) in the Sunday Morning Men's League at Marcin Bowl to post his personal best single game.

Jay started bowling at age 6 and has been knocking down the pins for 30 plus years. His sanctioned highest scores are 290 (he has two 300's - non-sanctioned) and 756. His most memorable accomplishment was sharing the experience with his son Sebastian in the Provincial Family Twosome Tournament in 2016 when they became provincial champions. He said "being a provincial champion with my 9 year old son was a far better feeling than any high scores I have achieved".


The once-a-week bowler finished with a 199 average with 99 games.










CTF CONNECTION CANADIAN YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS *



The 2019 Canadian Youth Championships were held in Edmonton, Alberta from May 29th to June 2nd. Eight teams of youth bowlers (64 athletes in total) from across the country competed in Singles, Doubles, and Team events over 3 days of competition at Ed's Bowling in the West Edmonton Mall.

The Opening Ceremonies and official practice took place on Thursday (May 30th) evening, with the Team Event taking place bright and early the next day. After 7 games of round-robin match-play competition in each of the 4 Divisions, there were some exciting finishes, and then there were even several tie-breakers needed to determine the final standings. In the Gold-Medal tie-breaker between Quebec and British Columbia, Quebec got the win and the Gold, with B.C. getting the Silver. And in the Bronze Medal tie-breaker, Southern Ontario edged out Alberta to win the Bronze.

On Saturday, it was all about the Doubles event. The boy and girl in each Division were paired up and




competed against all of the other Provincial doubles teams in a round-robin match-play format – once again, 7 games. But there were a couple of additional highlights on this day.
