BUILDER, Meritorious Service

Submit the completed application, use additional sheets if needed.

Please be advised the CTF Hall of Fame Committee will consider nominees whose national service has culminated with extraordinary results, achievements, or contributions to the sport of bowling. Do not submit Provincial or local service/achievements/honors.

Association/Administration Service

- A. CTF (ABC/WIBC/YABA) – provide years.
 - 1. National office(s) held.
 - 2. National committee service, provide years as chairperson.
- B. CTF National accomplishments, achievements, and contributions with results – provide years.
- C. Other National Bowling Organizations Service (Bowl Canada/BPAA/PBA/PWBA, etc.) and International Bowling Organizations Service – provide years.
 - 1. Office(s) held
 - 2. Committee service – provide years as chairman.
 - 3. Achievements and contributions – be specific as possible.
- D. Special Bowling Honors – provide years.
- E. For non-association or non-organization nominees, please list key accomplishments, contributions, inventions, etc. in regard to the progression of the sport of bowling - provide years.

BUILDER, Meritorious Service Coaching

Submit the completed application with a maximum of two (2) additional sheets for explanation and three (3) letters of recommendation.

Please be advised the CTF Hall of Fame Committee will consider nominees whose national service has culminated with extraordinary results, achievements or contributions to the sport of bowling. Do not submit Provincial or local service/achievements/honors.

Coaching

During his/her tenure as a coach, the nominee must have assisted bowlers by developing their skills and knowledge of the sport through analytical training, instructions in relevant skills, and providing encouragement. Nominees must show they have made a significant impact toward the improvement and growth of the sport of bowling.

- A. Certification – must have a CTF Comp Dev or higher
 - 1. Certification levels with date(s) earned.
 - 2. Must have a minimum of 15 years of active coaching. Provide years.
- B. Coaching history – provide years and dates
 - 1. High School
 - 2. Collegiate
 - 3. National/International teams
 - 4. Professional tour
 - 5. Document level of success of former and/or current students.
- C. Describe how their knowledge of the mechanics of bowling was taught (ball fit, layouts, lane conditions)
 - 1. Bowling camps or clinics
 - 2. Seminars
 - 3. Published books or articles

Submit up to three (3) letters of recommendation from students attesting to the nominee's coaching techniques, interactions with people, mental preparation and impact on student's performance on and off the lanes. Letters must be 250 words or less

Athlete/SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE

The Committee may waive these requirements based on a nominee's career being shortened by reasons beyond his/her control. The following information is to be provided:

- 1. Nominee must be 40 years of age as of January 1 of the year of induction.
- 2. Nominee must have participated in a CTF-approved event for at least twenty (20) years. If the nominee competed in both CTF and professional events in the same year, that year counts as one (1) year.

- v. USBC Open Championships (ABC Championships Tournament)

- xi. U.S. Open
- xii. U.S. Women's Open
- xiii. One (1) year as a touring professional.
- 3. Nominee must have two (2) of the following:
 - i. Professional titles (PBA, PWBA, LPBT)
 - ii. World Championships Medal
 - iii. Pan Am Championships Medal (minimum of 3)
 - iv. Male nominee: CTF 200 average for twenty (20) years
 - v. Female nominee: CTF 190 average for twenty (20) years
- 4. International competition, top-3 finishes (WTBA/FIQ) World and Zone, World Cup, Tournament of the Americas, World Games, etc.
 - i. Other International Championships

Additional accomplishments in national, international and other important bowling events, with years provided, may be considered by the Committee.
